What would that look like?

A passionate belief in prayer - 1000 Baptists to fast for forty days

Launching the presidential year 2021 with a call to 40 days of purposeful prayer as we seek God to move in reaching new people for Jesus. This prayer spearheaded through calling a thousand of us to commit to a 40 day fast - for the lost we long to see saved; for our

local churches and her leaders; and for the lives of the most vulnerable and least loved to be transformed. With a package of resources to enable this unified call at whatever level of engagement.

Simple resources - helping all Christians speak about Jesus

A commitment to provide resources for simple, fun giveaways at key festival times that open up a conversation about Jesus between Christians and their friends, neighbours and colleagues. We have found these extremely fruitful, creating space to talk about Jesus in a way people are interested in and open to.

I am praying to see a 100,000 of these resources enabling a Jesus-directed conversation as they are given away, individual to individual as ordinary Christians tell the story of our wonderful, welcoming God.

Firestarter conversations - growing churches helping to grow churches

One of the great privileges of the last few years has been to lead a team of our fastest growing Baptist churches to host Firestarter conversations. Many of our Baptist churches have been part of these conversations over the last two years. We have seen God produce surprising results in renewed churches, new congregations birthed, and lots and lots of baptisms.

Firestarter conversations are intentionally small, two day forums. Leadership teams gather to listen to the stories of these growing churches, to learn the lessons of how God is at work, and to commit together to action. Part funded by our national body, working in partnership with associations, they are having tangible gospel impact on our local churches. I am praying for 500 church leaders to be impacted by Firestarter conversations through

their local churches seeing twice the number of baptisms in the twelve months following as the five years previously.

We do not want to be left wondering what God might have done if we had trusted more and tried harder. It is his work. He will do what he chooses to do, and we will praise him for it as we play our part serving our local churches to be confident in God.

Please join me as we pray together to discern our 2021 president.
